2006 MATHCOUNTS OAHU CHAPTER COMPETITION RESULTS

Did you graduate from public school or private school? Or did your kids go to public school or private school? Oh well, the good news for public school is that the Highlands Intermediate School's math team placed fourth and the Kawananakoa Middle School's math team placed fifth out of 32 middle schools competing in the MATHCOUNTS 2006 Oahu Chapter Competition, and are two of the six Oahu math teams that will represent Oahu in the Hawaii State MATHCOUNTS Competition on March 11, 2006. Other public schools performing well as a team included Washington Middle School in seventh place, Jarrett Middle School in eighth place, and Moanalua Middle School in ninth place. Kahuku Intermediate School was named the "Best New School." This is the award made to the highest scoring school that did not participate in last year's competition, and has not placed in the top ten.

For more good public school news Dong-Gil Shin of Jarrett Middle School placed third, Sherilyn Tomagawa of Kawananakoa Middle School placed fourth, and Jordan Lum of Highlands Intermediate School placed tenth in the individual scoring out of 226 students competing.

The 23rd MATHCOUNTS Oahu Chapter Competition was held Saturday, February 11, 2006, in the Kamehameha Schools Kalama Dining Hall. Kamehameha Schools have been hosting Hawaii MATHCOUNTS for most of these 23 years, and it is a pleasure to report that the Kamehameha Middle School team placed third, with Aaron Nagao placing second in both the individual scoring and the Countdown Round.

Punahou School took home the Hawaii Society of Professional Engineers' "Perpetual Team Trophy" for being the top team in this competition. Coach Evelyn Cheong who was last year's State Team Coach at the MATHCOUNTS National Competition held in Detroit Michigan leads them. Team members Nicole Sato placed fifth, Sarah Loui sixth, and Eric Liaw placed seventh.

The Iolani School team took second place with the outstanding William Chambers winning both the individual scoring and Countdown Round. Team members Scott Sakaida and Anders Lee placed eighth and ninth, respectively, in individual scoring.

MATHCOUNTS is a national math enrichment, coaching and competition program that promotes middle school mathematics achievement through grassroots involvement in every U.S. state and territory. MATHCOUNTS is one of the most successful education partnerships involving volunteers, educators, industry sponsors, and students. With new focus on innovation, education to strengthen U.S. competitiveness urged by corporate and academic leaders, take note that MathCounts has been a leader in this effort for 23 years.

Each year the participation by middle schools (6th, 7th and 8th graders) increases. Each school has a team of 4 Mathletes® and up to 4 alternate Mathletes®. At both Chapter and State competitions, they all go through three grueling rounds of math problem solving. The first is the Sprint Round with its 30 problems, and then comes the Target Round and its 8 multi-step problems, and finally the Team Round with 10 problems solved by the team of 4 Mathletes®. The top scoring individuals move on to the Countdown Round where pairs of Mathletes® compete against each other and the clock. Although MathCounts questions are written with the curricula for grades 6-8 in mind, many of us Engineers would not want to compete against these students. The school coaches prepare their teams like school athletes. Problem solving strategies are practiced along with hours and hours of problem solving.

On May 11-14, 2006, Hawaii's four top Mathletes® will be in Arlington, Va. to take part in the Lockheed Martin MATHCOUNTS National Competition.

The Hawaii Society of Professional Engineers (HSPE) has sponsored the Hawaii MATH-COUNTS for these past 23 years. Dr. Michael Chun, President and Headmaster of Kamehameha Schools, is the Hawaii MATHCOUNTS Chairman. Continual, supportive major sponsors have been Aloha Airlines and Hawaiian Electric Company (HECO). Every year volunteers from HECO, the US Army Corp of Engineers, ASCE, ASME, SSFM, and SAME help proctor and score the competitions.

Legislation and the Business of Engineering

One of ACECH's major roles is promoting the business interests of the engineering industry in the State Legislature. ACECH seeks passage of legislation and policies that create a favorable business climate in which the engineering industry can help Hawaii grow and improve the quality of life for its citizens. ACECH is part of a larger advocacy umbrella group (the Coalition of Hawaii Engineering and Architectural Professionals, or CHEAP) that includes all the major engineering societies and the AIA. We also work actively with groups such as professional liability insurers, the Building Industry Association and the General Contractors Association to promote legislature that benefits the construction and design professional industry in Hawaii.

Here's a summary of the bills that we are following this year:

Removal of the word "defend" from the State Contract Indemnification clause

House Bill (HB) 2594/Senate Bill (SB) 3198 seeks to remedy the current State contract requirement for a person or entity providing design professional services to "defend" the State. We note that such onerous requirements are not included in Federal contracts, and that the City and County of Honolulu removed the "defend" requirement from their contract in 1995. Inclusion of the word "defend" in an indemnity with regard to claims arising from professional negligence creates liability beyond professional liability (E&O) insurance coverage. While the "defend" provision has existed in State design contracts for decades, its presence has become a critical issue in the past few years due to the current State Attorney General (AG) tendering the State's defense cost to design firms.

A similar bill was passed by the legislature last year but was vetoed by the Governor because of objectionable language in the preamble to the Senate version, which was the version passed out of Committee. Over the past year, we attempted to resolve this issue administratively with the Attorney General's office. The AG's office agreed to revise the clause and to encourage the Departments and Agencies to use the revised clause. However, we felt that the letter issued was weak, authorizing removal of the defense clause only on a case-by-case basis, and for projects where the design professional's services are "minimal". We have already had reports from our members that agencies are not willing to take the extra time to consult with the AG to remove the "defend" term.

Through a lot of work, we have convinced key legislators that the requirement for design professionals to defend the State is unfair, and we have kept it moving through the legislature. We believe that the bill has a good chance to move to and be passed out of joint House/Senate Committee, and finally be signed into law.

Certificate of Merit

Many malpractice and negligence claims brought against architects and engineers may have no material basis or justification in fact or in law. Even in those instances where the inclusion of the design professional in a malpractice lawsuit may be peripheral, meritless, or frivolous, financial consequences are likely as the design professional is forced to undertake a defense and incur expenses up to the point of dismissal.

HB1417/SB1836 seeks to provide design professionals with some measure of protection from frivolous and/or unfounded malpractice actions by requiring that, before the filing of a claim against a design professional for failure to meet the standard of care, the claimant or their attorney must file a Certificate of Merit that states that a qualified design professional of the same discipline as the defendant has been consulted as to the merits of the complaint, and believes that there is a sufficient basis in contract or in law for commencement of the action.

Our strongest opposition to this bill is from the plaintiff attorneys' lobbyist.

We have not had this bill heard yet this year. It was deferred from 2005 and awaits hearing by a joint House Consumer Protection and Commerce (CPC) and JUD committee. It was never heard by the Senate so is dead there again this year. However, the Chairs of House CPC/JUD have agreed to hear the bill and, if it passes out of that joint committee, it still has time to cross over to the Senate.

Various procurement-related bills

ACECH (along with the State Procurement Office and DAGS) is opposing three bills (SB2995, SB2996 and SB2997) that provide individual State agencies with what we believe are unacceptable exemptions from the State procurement code.

We are also opposing SB2625, which would amend HRS 103D by adding a preference for bidders employing persons with disabilities (physical or mental impairment). The bill states that, "(w)hen a governmental body contracts for goods, services, or construction, a preference shall be given to a responsible and responsive bidder who pledges to hire individuals with disabilities". We believe that this bill does not an appropriate or practical method of providing a preference and would be an unreasonable burden on design professional firms.

All four of these bills have been heard and were passed out of one or two committees, and await hearing in the final committee, Ways and Means (WAM). We will continue to oppose these bills and inform you of the outcome.

Want to help??

Most of the effort on behalf the design professional community this year has been by the key ACECH Board and CHEAP members (principally Lester Fukuda, who is an invaluable resource because of the many years he has lobbied on the industry's behalf at the legislature and the contacts that he has made there). It takes a lot of work to get bills passed, and these people can spend up to 10-15 hours a

JANUARY REGION 8 BOARD MEETING – SALT LAKE CITY, UTAH

In 2004, ASCE members voted to adopt broad changes to its governance structure. These changes included the establishment of regional board of governors to bring management and operations closer to the members. Accordingly, North America was subdivided into ten regions. Hawaii was made a part of Region 8 that also includes Alaska, Arizona, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, and Washington.

The Region 8 Board of Governors includes one region director (Greg DiLoreto who was District 12 Director) and seven governors (includes Mark Woodson who was District 11 Director and Westley Chun from the Hawaii Section). In October 2006, Greg and Mark will be stepping down. Westley and Larry Bennett from Alaska will be the official candidates for the region director seat. The candidate not elected will continue as governor. The official candidates for the two vacant governor seats will be Robert Russell from the Nevada Section and Michael Barton from the Arizona Section.

The first Region 8 Board of Governors meeting was held on January 12, 2006 in Salt Lake City, Utah. The following four committees were formed with each committee chaired by a governor: Awards Committee chaired by Guna Gunalan, Budget/Finance Committee chaired Woodson, Communications Committee chaired by Larry Bennett, and Resolutions Committee chaired by Westley Chun. During the meeting, the board approved the 2006 budget and passed a resolution to have ASCE ExComm conduct a hearing in Hawaii for Hawaii Section members who have been investigated by the Committee on Professional Conduct for allegedly violating Hawaii's campaign spending laws.

The next governors meeting will be in Honolulu on May 19.

HIGHLIGHTS OF BOD MEETING

February 8, 2006

Committee Reports:

Membership Committee: No applications for SEAOH membership were received to vote on. 2006 SEAOH Convention Committee: 37 people have already signed up to attend the 2006 SEAOH Convention in Japan. The maxi-

mum number of people that can attend is 80.





week in meetings and hearings at the State Capitol during the thick of the legislative season.

The work could be spread out if more people in our industry participated. Getting involved in the legislative process is an eye-opening (and mostly fun) experience. If you are interested in how these laws get made, join us at one of the hearings and see how things happen! Personal testimony definitely helps. And a strong showing of written testimony in support of our position is crucial. For example, testimony has been key to keeping HB2594/SB3198 moving despite continued opposition from the State administration. However, despite our pleas (and sending out sample testimony to make submittal easier), we still only get testimony from about 10-15 firms or individuals. Please keep in mind that a few volunteers are spending a lot of time on your behalf, and try to respond to requests for testimony. We appreciate the support!
