2017 BALLOTS & SURVEY

Towards the end of January, members will be receiving our Hawaii Section notice to visit SurveyMonkey.com for our annual ballots and survey. In the July 2016 Wiliki article, the changes to Section Operations affecting the Hawaii Section were outlined as follows. All sections-created bylaws have been discontinued with all sections following one ASME Bylaws. Instead of "section," "group" is being used more with former section officers known as group leadership team with voting roles. The titles of the group leaders remain the same, except we cannot have leaders called directors. There can be only two "Members" formerly known as directors. Previously, our now defunct bylaws called for up to four directors. In addition, the titles "Officer," "Director," "President," or "Vice-President" are not to be used for any Group volunteer positions.

Group participants are placed into "Voting" and "Non-voting" roles. The Group Leadership Team (GLT) has the Voting roles. Committee chairs and committee members fall in the Non-voting supporting roles.

Starting with our 2017 ballots, we will elect the same titles Chair, Vice-Chair, Treasurer, and Secretary, but instead of Directors, we will include two positions called "Members", and also a "Group Page Administrator." It is stressed that the Chair and the Treasurer must be two different individuals. Each Group leadership position on the GLT shall be nominated for a 1-year term, with a maximum of 3 consecutive years of service in a particular position (e.g., Chair, or Treasurer) for any given volunteer.

ASCE HAWAII SECTION JANUARY DINNER MEETING

The January Dinner Meeting is scheduled to be held on Thursday Jan. 12th.

Description: Makai Ocean Engineering, Inc. owns and operates what is currently the world's largest operational Ocean Thermal Energy Conversion (OTEC) power plant at the Natural Energy Laboratory of Hawaii Authority (NELHA), near the Kona Airport. In the summer of 2015, the power plant was connected to the Big Island electrical grid, with a maximum capacity of 105 kilowatts. The purpose of the project is to determine the reduction in the levelized cost of energy (LCOE) for OTEC through improvements in its component technologies, with a strong focus on the marine heat exchangers. Project specifics, challenges met and overcome, and the current state and future of OTEC development will be presented.
